Subject: TEXT with 9-1-1 for Deaf, Deafened, Hard of Hearing or Speech Impaired

Background:

It was recently announced that the TEXT with 9-1-1 (T9-1-1) service is available for deaf, deafened, hard of hearing or speech impaired individuals in a number of Provinces, including 470 communities in Ontario, including the entire geographic Perth County area. This service will provide 9-1-1 call takers and emergency services the ability to converse with a caller during an emergency, using text messaging.

In order to use the T9-1-1 service, a cellular phone must be compatible with T9-1-1 requirements, must be registered with a cellular phone company, and must have the capability to send and receive text messages. Cellular phone company websites provide details on registering phones and compatibility with T9-1-1 service.
